INSTRUCTION for AUTHORS

The Jurnal Iktiologi Indonesia (JII) publishes original research articles encompassing all aspects of fish (Pisces) inhabiting freshwater, brackish, and marine environments. The scope includes biology, physiology, taxonomy and systematics, genetics, and ecology, as well as their applications in fisheries, aquaculture, fisheries management, and conservation. Manuscripts submitted to JII must report the complete results of original scientific research.

JII also accepts book reviews relevant to the journal's scope. In addition, review articles addressing significant and current topics may be published upon invitation from the Editorial Board. Comments on, and responses to, articles previously published in JII are also welcome and may be considered for publication.

JII is published three times annually, in February, June, and October. The final issue of each volume contains the table of contents, author index, and subject index for the entire volume.

Manuscripts must be written in English and must not have been previously published or be under consideration for publication elsewhere. The Editorial Board reserves the right to accept or reject manuscripts based on their relevance to the scope of JII. Accepted manuscripts may be edited or condensed for clarity, consistency, and adherence to journal style, without altering their scientific content. The views expressed in published articles are solely those of the authors and do not necessarily reflect those of the Editorial Board or the publisher.

Unless otherwise specified, the first author will be considered the corresponding author. Authors whose manuscripts are accepted for publication agree to transfer copyright to the publisher, the Masyarakat Iktiologi Indonesia (Indonesian Ichthyological Society). Page proofs will be sent to the corresponding author for review. Corrected proofs, along with the signed copyright transfer agreement, must be returned to the Editorial Board within one week.

Authors reporting novel findings or inventions are strongly encouraged to secure appropriate intellectual property protection,

including patent applications where applicable, prior to publication in JII.

Manuscript Submission

Manuscripts may be submitted at any time by sending a soft copy to the JII Editorial Board through the journal website:

jurnal-iktiologi.org

All submitted manuscripts will be evaluated by the Editorial Board and subsequently reviewed by two competent anonymous peer reviewers. The peer-review process is intended to provide constructive evaluations and to ensure that manuscripts published in JII meet a high scientific standard.

The following guidelines are intended to assist authors in preparing manuscripts for submission to JII. Manuscripts prepared in accordance with these instructions will facilitate and expedite the review and editorial process.

Manuscript Preparation

Authors should ensure that their manuscripts are prepared clearly and consistently by following the guidelines below.

- Use A4 paper size with margins of 3 cm on all sides. Pages should be numbered consecutively at the bottom right corner.
- The manuscript should be formatted in a single-column layout throughout.
- Manuscripts should be prepared using Microsoft Word for Windows, typed in Times New Roman, 12-point font, with 1.5-line spacing. Different fonts may be used in figures where appropriate.
- Text should be left-aligned only (do not justify the text).
- Use a single space (not double spaces) after punctuation marks (periods, commas, colons, and semicolons).
- Use the International System of Units (SI) for all measurements and weights.
- Scientific names of organisms must follow the appropriate international nomenclatural codes (e.g., the International Code of Zoological Nomenclature). Genus and species names must be written in italic type.
- Do not use the slash symbol (/) to indicate "per" in units. Instead, use negative

exponents, for example, write 9 m s⁻¹ instead of 9 m/s.

- Avoid abbreviations unless they are defined at their first occurrence. The full term should be written out first, followed by the abbreviation in parentheses.
- Dates should be written in the format day month year, for example, 12 September 2010. In tables and figures, month names should be abbreviated using the first three letters (e.g., Feb, Jun, Oct).
- Maps must include latitude and longitude references and indicate the source of the data.
- Photographs or illustrations of organisms or their anatomical parts must include a scale bar or other appropriate indication of scale.
- Ensure that all figures are numbered consecutively in the order in which they are cited in the text. Figure numbers and captions should be placed below the figures.
- Ensure that all tables are numbered consecutively according to their citation in the text. Table numbers and titles should be placed above the tables. Table titles should be clear, complete, and informative. Data sources and explanatory notes should be placed below the table. Vertical lines should not be used in tables. Horizontal lines should be limited to those above and below the column headings and at the bottom of the table.
- Authors are solely responsible for the accuracy of all references cited. JII uses the author–year citation system. In the text, citations should be presented as Rahardjo & Simanjuntak (2007) or (Rahardjo & Simanjuntak 2007) for one or two authors, and Sjafai et al. (2008) or (Sjafai et al. 2008) for three or more authors. Multiple references cited together should be arranged chronologically, for example: (Gonzales et al. 2000; Stergiou & Moutopoulos 2001; Khaironizam & Norma-Rashid 2002; Abdurahiman et al. 2004; Frota et al. 2004; Tarkan et al. 2006). References published in the same year should be arranged alphabetically by the first author's surname. Multiple publications by the same author(s) in the same year should be distinguished by lowercase letters following the publication

year, for example: Sjafai 2018a and Sjafai 2018b.

Manuscript Structure

Title

The title should be centered, concise, accurate, and informative, clearly reflecting the content of the manuscript. The main title should be presented in bold, 13-point font

Authors and Affiliations

Authors' names should be written in regular, 12-point font. Affiliations should be presented in regular, 9-point font, including the full name and address of the institution, together with the postal code. The e-mail addresses of all authors must be provided.

Abstract

The abstract must be written in English, with a maximum length of 250 words. It should briefly describe the objective of the study, the methods employed, the principal results, and the main conclusion. Avoid the use of abbreviations and references. The abstract should consist of a single paragraph.

Keywords

Provide up to seven keywords in English, arranged alphabetically.

Introduction

The Introduction should clearly explain the background and rationale of the study. Previous relevant studies (the current state of knowledge) should be concisely reviewed to establish the context of the research. The research objectives should be clearly stated.

Materials and Methods

This section should describe the materials and methods in sufficient detail to allow the study to be reproduced. The study location, period of research, and specifications of equipment used should be clearly stated.

Results

Present the findings clearly and objectively based on the methods employed. This section should contain only the results of the study and should not include references to the literature.

Discussion

The scientific value of a manuscript is largely determined by the quality of its discussion. Interpret the findings in relation to previous studies and support the interpretations with appropriate evidence and relevant references. Unexpected findings or anomalies should be adequately explained. Authors are strongly encouraged to cite recent primary literature, preferably published within the last 10 years.

Conclusion

The conclusion should be concise, clearly stated, and directly address the objectives of the study.

Acknowledgements (if applicable)

This section should recognize institutions, funding agencies, or individuals who have made significant contributions to the research or the preparation of the manuscript.

References

References should be arranged alphabetically according to the surname of the first author. Ensure that every reference cited in the text appears in the reference list, and that every reference listed has been cited in the text.

Journal Articles

Write the full title of the article. Capitalize only the first word of the title and proper nouns. The journal title should be written in full (not abbreviated) and in *italic*, followed by the volume number, issue number (if applicable), and page range in roman type.

Example:

Lauer TE, Doll JC, Allen PJ, Breidert B, Palla J. 2008. Changes in yellow perch length frequencies and sex ratios following closure of the commercial fishery and reduction in sport bag limits in southern Lake Michigan. *Fisheries Management and Ecology*, 15(1): 39–47.

Books

Book titles should be written in *italic*. Capitalize the principal words of the title, except articles, conjunctions, and prepositions. Include the publisher, place of publication, and total number of pages.

Example:

Berra TB. 2001. *Freshwater Fish Distribution*. Academic Press, San Francisco. 640 p.

Translated Books

For translated books, include the name of the translator.

Examples:

Nikolsky GV. 1963. *The Ecology of Fishes*. Translated from Russian by L. Birkett. Academic Press, London and New York. 352 p.

Steel GD, Torrie JH. 1981. *Prinsip-prinsip dan Prosedur Statistika*. Translated by Bambang Sumantri. PT Gramedia Pustaka Utama, Jakarta. 747 p.

Chapters in Edited Books or Conference Proceedings

References to chapters in edited books or conference proceedings should include the author(s), year of publication, chapter title, editor(s), title of the book or proceedings (in *italic*), publisher, place of publication, and page numbers.

Examples:

Bleckmann H. 1993. Role of lateral line in fish behaviour. In: Pitcher TJ (ed.). *Behaviour of Teleost Fishes*. Chapman and Hall, London. pp. 201–246.

Simanjuntak CPH, Zahid A, Rahardjo MF, Hadiaty RK, Krismono, Haryono, Tjakrawidjaja AT (eds.). 2011. *Prosiding Seminar Nasional Ikan VI*. Bogor, 8–9 June 2010. Masyarakat Iktiologi Indonesia, Cibinong. 612 p.

Unpublished Material

Limited citations of unpublished results, manuscripts in preparation, submitted manuscripts, or personal communications should be cited only in the text and should not be included in the References.

In Press Publications

Articles and books that have been accepted for publication but have not yet been published should be designated as "in press."

Other Types of Contributions

Review articles, book reviews, and comments or responses to previously published articles are not

required to follow the manuscript structure described above.
